- Investigate the work of a religious charity
- Explore the values that motivates people of faith to respond to a cause
- Find out about the teachings of significant religious people
- Explore commitment as demonstrated in the lives and work of significant faith believers
- Explain how other people are inspired by the actions of significant people of faith
- Reflect on what influences these faith believers

### Sticky Knowledge

- People of faith respond to the teachings of their most holy person.

- Many people have a vocation: they feel compelled to help others.
- Random acts of kindness are valued by those people who receive them.
- The 'ultimate sacrifice' is when someone gives up their life to protect others
