

Art

In this unit of work, the children will learn about print making. They will explore printing techniques and create a print of the moon. They will use a square of card and add different textures to it which they will then print to represent the moon.

In this unit children will:

- Learn about different ways to print.
- Explore what happens when you roll ink onto different textures and print it etc bubble wrap, string stuck on card, leaves etc
- They will explore the idea that print making is useful in the arts because it is affordable and produces many copies.
- Use different materials to create a print of the moon.
- Begin to understand how to evaluate their work.



Key Vocabulary

texture – the children will explore the different textures the different materials make. Different textures will produce different patterns.

Print making - a form of art which is used as a way of producing more than one image. It is often a cheaper form of art because there are more than one for sale.

position – the children will need to think about where to position their plate on their paper and where to position their different materials to create an image of the moon.

tint - when a colour is made lighter by adding white.

shade – when a colour is made darker by adding black.

Relief printing – printing from raised images

Evaluate – thinking about their final image and if they liked it and how it could be improved.
