 tu and vous
- Be able to write the correct form of regular
 -er verbs for je, tu and vous
- Read and understand the gist of a story in French
- Use reading strategies to understand a text in French
- Have the confidence to read out loud parts of a French text

- The ne... pas in a negative statement always goes around the verb.
