

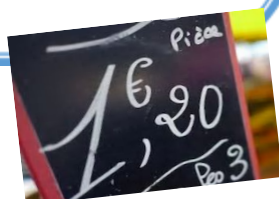
## Ça pousse! (Growing things!)

In this unit of work the children will learn how to buy things and how to order in a café or restaurant.

They will also be responding to a story in French.

### In this unit children will:

- Revisit expressions of like and dislike
- Make simple statements about what foods you like/dislike
- Learn key phrases for buying items in a shop
- Learn key phrases for ordering food and drink in a café or restaurant.
- Know that both *il* and *elle* can be used for 'it'.
- Ask a simple question (without inversion)
- Learn to recognise the verb endings for *je*, *tu* and *vous*
- Be able to write the correct form of regular -er verbs for *je*, *tu* and *vous*
- Read and understand the gist of a story in French
- Use reading strategies to understand a text in French
- Have the confidence to read out loud parts of a French text



### Key Vocabulary

Tu aimes? – *Do you like?*

J'aime – *I like*

J'adore – *I love*

Je n'aime pas – *I don't like*

Je déteste – *I can't stand*

Ça va pour – *It's okay*

beaucoup – *lots, very much*

Je voudrais – *I would like*

s'il vous plaît – *please*

Vous désirez? – *What would you like?*

Voilà! – *There you go!*

merci – *thank you*

Au revoir – *Goodbye*

### Sticky Knowledge

- *Je voudrais* is one of the most useful French phrases you will learn!
- Expressions of like and dislike can be used with food, colours, pets, etc.
- When asking a simple question, your voice will go up at the end!
- Regular -er verb endings for *je* and for *il /elle* are the same: add *-e*.
- The *ne... pas* in a negative statement **always** goes around the verb.
- An 'h' in French is always silent if it comes before 'a' or 'i'.

- How do I pronounce this in French?
- What's the easiest way to ask a question in French?
- Why are so many English words the same as French words?
- How will I know what this French text says if I've never seen it before?
