Art and Design

As a part of exploring Hull. The children will be looking at landmarks in Hull. They will create their own sculptures using a variety of found objects. Children will work collaboratively to build a sculpture inspired by Hull.

In this unit children will:

- Sketch image of landmarks in Hull. Annotate what they do and don't like about them.
- Explore the work of Anthony Gormley.
- Children will explore the history of Hull and create a mind map to come up with inspiration for their sculptures.
- Create a sculpture using found objects outside to represent Hull.
- Work collaboratively to create a large sculpture inspired by Hull.
- If possible pupils will visit an art gallery either with school or for homework.
