

## How has entertainment changed over time?

In this unit of work the children will look at the changes of leisure and entertainment in the twentieth century. The children will look at cinema, holidays, the health service, technology and music.

### In this unit children will:

- Travel through the twentieth century and look at the changes in leisure and entertainment.

- Looking at the radical changes in technology across time and how this has impacted and changed everyday life.
- Learn about how holidays have evolved and the founding of Butlins by Billy Butlin himself.
- Learn about the changes in United Kingdom in the Health Service and how this has changed peoples lives.

**decade** - ten years.


**nation** – a large body of people.

## Key Knowledge

- Charlie Chaplin's **silent film** 'Between Showers' was one of the first to be shown at the **cinema** in 1914.
- Film posters were very important in film **promotion** in the **early 20<sup>th</sup> century**.
- The first **World Cup** was held in Uruguay in 1930.
- The World Cup stopped for twelve years for **WWII**.
- England won the **World Cup** in 1966.
- The 1960's were known as '**The Swinging Sixties**' because of how much fun people had in that **decade**, especially with dancing.
- **Billy Butlin** founded **Butlins** family holidays in 1939, because of this a law was passed for all people to be entitled a week's holiday.



- In 1929, the first television **broadcast** was made in the UK.
- The **NHS** was founded in UK in 1948.
- Mobile phones were **invented** in 1973 but were not available to buy until 1983.
