

Computing - Autumn 2 - Year 2

This term's eSafety focus is about learning what online bullying is, and what to do about it.

Children will learn to use the internet to research, and record their ideas and findings in a word processing document or presentation software.

In this unit children will:

- begin to understand what is meant by online bullying and its consequences
- create an anti online bullying slogan to send a strong message that bullying is never acceptable.
- use technology purposefully to retrieve digital content (learn how to search the internet)
- Use a search engine
- Compare the results of different search engines
- Copy information and images from the internet

Search engine - a general name for website such as Google or Yahoo

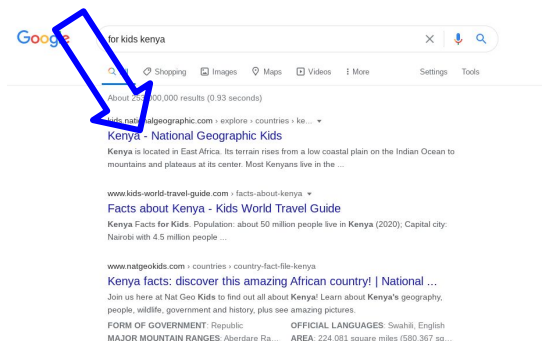
child-friendly search engines - websites that have been created especially for children.

Links - a link will take you from one website to another.



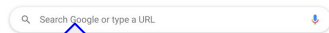
Key Knowledge
