- ABBA were trailblazers in pop music of the 70s and 80s.
- ABBA won the Eurovision Song Contest in 1974.
- The band name ABBA was made up from the first letter of the band members names.
- The band members were two married couples. A lot of the songs they had written and sang were about themselves.
- The composition of ABBA's music is studied in universities.
- Their musical style is very distinctive.
- ABBA's early work was influenced by Swedish folk music.
- They are known for their disco and art rock styles, as well as the 'mini-musical' within a song.
- The band broke up in 1982 but are still very popular today – who knows if they will ever get back together?
