Please try and speak about the different spelling rules with your child so it is embedded. Week 1 Words ending in '-er' when the root word ends in (t)ch.	Week 2 Words with the /k/ sound spelled 'ch.' These words have their origins in the Greek language.	Week 3 Words ending with the /g/ sound spelt '-gue' and the /k/ sound spelt '-que.' These words are French in origin.	Week 4 Words with the /s/ sound spelled 'sc' which is Latin in its origin.	Week 5 The prefix bi- meaning two.	Week 6 Words which have the same pronunciation but different meanings and/or spellings.	Week 7 Challenge Words
