### **Punctuality**

Being on time for school teaches our pupils how to behave when they need to hold down a job, go for interviews or further their careers in University or College. Without this skill they are unlikely to succeed in these areas.

On the rare occasion your child is late, they must go through the school office so we ensure we know what they would like to do for lunch. Lateness may affect your child's attendance.

Pupils coming to school late miss valuable learning time and often do not make as much progress as those with good punctuality.

#### Uniform

When buying next year's uniform please buy appropriate PE kits. This should be blue or black tracksuit bottoms or shorts and a plain white t-shirt. Pupils will need long hair tied back and earrings covered or removed for PE. Pupils MUST NOT wear any other colour than black or blue tracksuits.

#### Homework

Please ensure your child is completing their homework from their learning beyond the classroom book weekly. That they are reading regularly and learning their spellings.
